From Your Pastor ~

My family has always done things a bit out of the ordinary. For instance, my siblings and our families generally celebrate Christmas on New Year's Eve.

This year our "out of the ordinary" trait took another "out of the ordinary" twist. The next generation (all in their 20s and early 30s) began to communicate, in a few emails before Thanksgiving, their dissatisfaction about our traditional Christmas gift exchange.

They were saying things like, "I don't need more stuff" or "I don't like all the expectations and anxiety about what to buy." The proposal was that instead of buying gifts for each other, we donate money to help people in need.

Post-Thanksgiving dinner conversation grew pretty intense as people shared their ideas and listened to understand what others have experienced. In the end, we dropped the gift exchange and agreed to be generous toward others.

On New Year's Eve, in place of the gift exchange, we'll each tell how we donated to help someone in need and why we chose what we did. It will be interesting to learn what is important to each person.

Now apparently our "out of the ordinary" is not so unique. I've been hearing this kind of talk in various Christian circles. But I hadn't imagined that apparently my family has been drawn into a conspiracy. There are actually people planning and plotting to change our attachment to a consumerdriven Christmas. I saw this in its most blatant form when someone pointed me to the web site of an organization called, "Advent Conspiracy". Check it out at adventconspiracy.org.

One article I read stated, "Advent Conspiracy is an international movement 'restoring the scandal of Christmas by worshipping Jesus through compassion, not consumption." The organization's mission, according to its website, is to encourage people to worship more, spend less, give more and love all. "Christmas was meant to change the world. It still can." is one of the group's mottos.

The web site suggests that Americans spend an average of \$450 billion a year on Christmas. Some have estimated that \$10 billion could solve the global water crisis.

The web site suggests that people buy one less present this year and in its place, donate to help people in need. The words sounded a lot like our Thanksgiving family discussion. Hmm! I've got some questions to ask of members of this younger generation on New Year's Eve.


