

From Your Pastor ~

I awake this morning with many things running through my mind. I check my list of responsibilities. My mind keeps racing to the opportunities I'd like to work on and the people I'd like to be with. But, I am also feeling the pressure of my schedule and deadlines to meet.

This is not an unfamiliar feeling to me. I know what I need. I need to allow God to bring order to my chaos.

I begin with about 10 minutes of quiet. I sit in a comfortable place and begin to pay attention to my breathing. "Lord Jesus Christ" I breathe in (I want Jesus' spirit to fill my heart, my lungs, my veins and arteries, my brain. As I begin, my anxieties, fears and desires are leaving no room for God). "Son of God" I breathe out (I want my life to share God with others. I want what I produce and give to the world to be of God, not of my anxiety and worry.).

For a while I breathe in "Lord Jesus Christ" and breathe out "Son of God." I can feel my heart rate lower and my mind slowing down. I keep a tablet near by. Thoughts come to me. thoughts are responsibilities I need to remember, others are thoughts about people or situations. I jot these down on paper so that I can let go of them and pick them up at another time. Right now is a time to be quiet. I want to be connected to God. I want to be connected to the things that are most important and central to my life.

As I feel more centered in God, I read a Psalm. The Psalm speaks about "walking in my integrity" and "trusting God without wavering." Later it says,

"for your steadfast love is before my eyes."

I can feel my day beginning to take shape. I still have a list of responsibilities, deadlines to meet and schedules to keep, but my eyes are already looking for God's steadfast love. When I sit down to breakfast, I see God's steadfast love in the provision of food, my health, and my marriage. God is good!

Today I want to walk in my integrity. I want to be true to who God has made me to be. I want to be honest and direct in my dealings with others.

My prayers today include each of you in our church family. I pray that you are finding ways to allow God to shape your life. I pray that you are seeing God's steadfast love and finding ways to allow God to work in and through you for others.

I share with you a little of my own journey, because I know it is not easy to stay focused on God. I want to share with you the joys and struggles of walking in the way of Jesus. I invite you to give and receive encouragement to each other.

New 30 Hour Famine Dates coming! Stay Tuned!

Chris was lucky. He got to eat breakfast this morning. A brown and white mushy breakfast will be the only meal he'll eat today. And in Zambia, where almost half the population – more than 5 million people – is hungry, Chris is blessed to have that mush.

But some kids won't get anything to eat—all day. And you won't see them on the TV or hear their stories on the radio. In fact, before this day is over, 26,000 children under age 5 will die because of hunger, disease and poverty.

14,000 of them will die from causes linked to malnutrition alone. Today... tomorrow... and the next day... *That's one every seven seconds.*

But here's the good news. Students at First Baptist, Manlius are choosing to make a difference. They are getting ready to take part in World Vision's 30 Hour Famine. They're going to raise money by not eating for 30 hours so that kids like Chris can eat every day.

In the coming weeks you'll hear more about the 30 Hour Famine. So here's where <u>YOU</u> come in: please pray for the Famine participants, and then prayerfully consider how you can offer your financial support to help save kids' lives.
