

### From Your Pastor ~

During this Lenten season we have been **focused on prayer**. My sermons look at various aspects of a life at prayer. *Share and Prayer Triplets* and the Wednesday night study all focus our attention on our relationship to God.

It is my desire that we grow in our God connection. I hope that each of us will take a new step in our habits of prayer. For one person, it may be the beginning of a daily time with God. Another may pray in a new way. How will you grow in your prayer life during these weeks that lead us to Holy Week and Easter?

Prayer was so central in Jesus' life! Over and over we read that Jesus rose before daylight and went out to a solitary place to be with God. He is in tune with God. That relationship leads him to Jerusalem and sustains him through the trials of Holy Week.

As we come to Holy Week, I invite you to join me as I prepare to celebrate God's greatest gift to us. Walk with Jesus each day:

### Holy Week

Palm Sunday – Jesus comes into Jerusalem. Each step is planned and the disciples trust and follow their instructions. Jesus enters the city to the shouts of a cheering crowd. What

the shouts of a cheering crowd. What a terrific day! (Matthew 21:1-11)

Monday – Jesus enters the Temple and drives out those who were profiting from religion. He challenges those who place barriers to God. "My house shall be called a house of prayer; but you are making it a den of robbers."

How can we become a "House of Prayer?" What would we need to let go? What would we need to claim? Matthew 21:12-13

**Tuesday** – Jesus is at the home of Simon when a woman comes and anoints him with an expensive ointment. Some scoff at her and accuse her of wastefulness. But Jesus praises her and affirms the desire to care for the spiritual. Matthew 26:6-13

Wednesday – Judas loses patience with God's plan. He takes things into his own hands. Sometimes it is so hard to trust God and his timing.

Matthew 26:14-16

**Thursday** – Jesus shares a last intimate dinner with his disciples. He talks of love and forgiveness. He then goes to God in anguish in the Garden to find strength and assurance to face the coming day of suffering and death. Matthew 26:17-46

**Friday** – Betrayal, arrest, trial, crowds, cruelty and death. Sometimes life is overwhelming with unbearable pain and darkness. Matthew 26:35-27:55

## Saturday - Silence

Slowly read Matthew 27:57-66. Imagine the darkness and absence of hope.

**Sunday** – From despair to fear to puzzlement to unbelievable joy and hope. Matthew 28:1-10

## <u>F.I.S.H.</u> (Friends in Service Here)

For some people transportation is not readily accessible, and the need to get to their medical appointments becomes critical. This is where F.I.S.H. comes in handy. The Favetteville-Manlius-Minoa chapter of F.I.S.H. has been operating for over 35 years and transports people from the Fayetteville, Manlius, or Minoa areas to and from doctors' appointments. Our clients do need to be ambulatory. F.I.S.H. is made up of all volunteers who give their time to dispatch, drive, or serve on various F.I.S.H. committees. We need scheduled drivers (one day a month) or random drivers (on an as-needed basis). If you prefer not to drive, we are in need of dispatchers, too. Dispatchers take the calls from clients one week a month and try and find drivers to transport them. If you would like to reach out and help members of our community get to their medical appointments, please give F.I.S.H. a call at 637-8158. You will meet wonderful people and at the same time be helping out people in need.
