

From Your Pastor ~

On Easter Sunday, this past week, we read the resurrection story in Matthew 28. One phrase from verse 8 stays with me: "afraid yet filled with joy".

The women had just encountered the angel sitting on the rolled-away stone at the empty tomb. He had given them an assignment, "Go quickly and tell his disciples..." In verse 8 we are told, "So the women hurried away from the tomb, afraid and yet filled with joy, and ran to tell his disciples."

scripture This is a picture of transformation. When we allow God to change our lives we can feel both fear and joy at the same time. Fear, because we give up control and allow God to lead us to places we may not have been before. Joy, because we are now on a path that has meaning and purpose. We are trusting in a power that can do far greater things through us than we can accomplish on our own. We are part of a movement that will offer joy and life to others.

"Fear yet filled with joy." The Nehemiah Team has met several times over the past months. We've been talking about our church and listening to what God may be speaking to us. On April 5th the team will attend a workshop to help us begin the envisioning process at First Baptist. We'll be learning to ask, "Who are We? Who is our Neighbor?" We are each a little apprehensive. Will our work bear fruit? Is the church ready to respond? But each of us are also full of anticipation for the wonderful things that God might do through this church.

How can a church be ready for transformation? It requires people to be open and attentive to the things God is doing. Prayer is central.

It is also important that people are connected to each other. God will speak to a congregation through the relationships of a faithful people. With that in mind, I will begin a new preaching series called, "One Anothering." Through out the New Testament there are several "one another" passages, such as "Love one another", "Pray for one another"...

Are you ready for transformation in your life? In the life of this church? Pray with me that God will build our fellowship and ready us for the work he is giving us to do.


New York State Outdoor Ministries.
