

From Your Pastor ~

We don't often focus on the ascension in our preaching and teaching. It is hard to explain. It's a mystery. And it is really important.

After Jesus was raised and before he ascended, he spent forty days with his disciples preparing them for his leaving. He promised that when he went away, he would send his Spirit and they would be "clothed with power from on high" (Luke 24:49)

In the Gospel of John, Jesus says, "the one who believes in me will do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father."

Wow! Those are some incredible promises. Jesus leaves so he can send his spirit and we will do greater works than he did!

So, how we understand the ascension makes all the difference. Jesus left! Either we are on our own (limited by our own power) or we are part of a God mission (limited only by his power). Either we have a great story from the past <u>or</u> we are part of a developing story.

Too often we live like Jesus left and now it's all up to us.

Tom Beers talks about the mystery of the ascension. He says, "God has chosen to use churches ... ordinary gatherings of ordinary people ... in the most extraordinary work of bearing the transforming power of the gospel into the world."

Do you believe that God has given First Baptist Church of Manlius something to offer, which people desperately need, and which we can uniquely and powerfully provide?

What do you understand that to be? What are these "greater works" that God is empowering us to do? What is the transforming power of the Gospel?

I believe that Jesus came into this world to show us God's love. All his miracles were to exhibit God's compassion and love. His greatest work at the cross showed us God's love. The "greater works" that God will do through us are to exhibit his love in this world.

How can we show God's love for this world? Is it in welcoming a refugee family into our community? Is it through our care for the children in our church family and in our community? Is it compassion for someone who has lost their job or praying for those in need of healing? What are the "greater works" God is giving us to do?

What's your take on the ascension?

MISSION NEWS

Refugee Resettlement Program

Our Mission Board has decided to assist a refugee family as they attempt to start a new life in Syracuse. These families arrive with only one suitcase each. The Center for New Americans helps them to find an apartment, a job, enroll their kids in school and begin English classes, but their needs extend beyond these basics. Coming from a tropical climate, they don't have any winter clothing and often their shoes are flip-flops. Many have lived in a refugee camp in relatively primitive conditions and are not familiar with all the elements of life in an American city. Simple tasks like buying groceries, or caring for a sick kid can become overwhelming. That is why they need us.

A small group of interested people have volunteered to help, led by Darlene Endy and Tom Shepard. We need volunteers:

- to transport donated furniture
- to store furniture
- to buy groceries when they arrive
- to donate money

We also need gently used household items and furniture to furnish an apartment:

sheets
towels
curtains
skillets
pillows
beds
blankets
chairs . . . everything!

We take our inspiration from the Bible: Matthew 25:35-40

"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me. Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you? "The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.""
