

From Your Pastor ~

I hope you have been enjoying the more relaxed pace of summer. I know that many of you have been away on vacation or doing special things with your family on weekends. Take time in this more relaxed time to pray, read and reflect on God's presence and leading in your life.

Summer Reading: During my week of vacation, in June, I read the book, <u>The Shack</u>, by William Young, suggested to me by a friend. It is an interesting story with good reflections on who God is and how we relate to God. It challenged me to think about how we experience healing when we have experienced significant loss in our lives. What does it look like when we are living faithfully in relationship with God?

Reading is a great way to encounter new ideas, confirm things we already believe and see new perspectives on life issues.

Having read the book, I decided I would enjoy discussing this with others. So I invite anyone interested to join me after worship in August (see the article in this newsletter for more information). You will find it helpful to have read the book before we begin. Come when you can.


