

#### FROM YOUR PASTOR

Our 40 Days of Purpose has drawn to a close. This past Sunday we celebrated the things we have learned, the new commitments we have made, the affirmation of basic beliefs we hold and rejoiced in new possibilities we see.

I am thankful that we journeyed together as a congregation. I have heard people encourage each other, ask questions, share new thoughts, resist some thoughts and be challenged by others. All of this is healthy and good. Most often I heard appreciation for the small groups. "I came to know people better." "I learned new things about people I have known for a long time." "I made a new friend." All of these are typical comments shared with me. Clearly, strengthening our connections is crucial for being Christ's church.

Sunday, December 3<sup>rd</sup> is the First Sunday in Advent. We will light a candle and begin our movement toward the manger.

Have you ever noticed that almost all the main characters in the Christmas story at some point must confront their fears? My sermons during Advent will look at 4 biblical characters: John the Baptist, Joseph, Mary and the Shepherds as they overcome their fear and respond to God's leading.

We are living in days when fear is evident in our culture and in our individual lives. How do we live beyond our fears? What does faith teach us? How might we respond?

The following are excerpts from a thank you from Pastor Mark Caruana at Tabernacle Baptist Church in Utica on behalf of their Refugee Ministry Team:

"Your support enables a team of dedicated volunteers to minister to the spiritual, physical, and social needs of the growing ethnic Karen community\* in Utica. About 250 Karen Christians are part of our congregation.

"These refugees face many challenges.

- learning a new culture and language
- working at low-wage jobs.
- purchasing warm winter clothing.

- Providing clothes, books and supplies for school-age children.
- Finding good daycare and nursery school settings for pre-school age children.

"Working with a regional food bank, we provide low-cost food items, diapers, and personal care items. Through the generosity of friends like you, we have made certain that each new refugee has warm boots, coat, gloves, and hats.

"Most important of all, we build relationships of trust and mutuality. We have discovered that as we reach out with the love of Christ to the newest residents of our community, we receive far more than we give. Your gift will enable us to continue this vital ministry of Christian hospitality and caring. Thank you for joining us in serving others in Jesus' name."

#### December 2006

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

When Hurricane Katrina devastated the Gulf Coast in August 2005, the Rev. Thom Black, age 80, and his wife Doris, 75, lost their home in Slidell, Louisiana. All that remained were the few things—documents, medications, photographs, a few clothes, and Thom's motorized scooter and walker—they had packed in their station wagon before escaping to their son's home in Foxworth, Mississippi.

"When we left, we thought we would be back in a few days, little realizing we would not see our home again," the couple wrote in their Christmas letter to family and friends. "Katrina was very unkind to us."

Thom, along with more than 3,000 retired American Baptist ministers, missionaries and widowed spouses, received a Thank You check in the fall of 2005. His check went to a new address in Ohio, where the Blacks had relocated to be near their three daughters. Thom and Doris sent the following note to American Baptist congregations:

"We received our Thank You check with gratitude following our great loss. Any gift we received was a blessing to us. We appreciate everyone who gives to this offering every year—it helps and blesses in many different ways."

Thank You checks, as well as emergency financial assistance, are made possible by the contributions of American Baptist congregations to the annual Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering (RMMO).


