

From Your Pastor

As I prepare to leave on two weeks of vacation, I am finishing preparations for some exciting things that will be happening this September. Here are three things I want you to be thinking about and plan to attend:

- 1. Life Cycle Workshop: In the planning for Saturday morning, September 29th (confirmation pending) is a workshop to which everyone will be invited. This will be a first step in a long term planning process. The workshop, which will be led by Rev. Tom Beers, will help us assess our next steps as a church.
- 2. **Basic Bible: Getting Started**. We begin the Sunday School year for adults with a class intended to help you get started reading the Bible. Whether you are new to the Bible or have had a habit of reading the Bible for many years, you will find something in this for you. I will teach the class on Sunday morning. We are hopeful that the class will also be offered on a week day evening.
- 3. My September **preaching series**, "Eat This Book!" will invite you to make the scriptures a regular and deep part of your life.

In the final days of summer, find time to rest and reflect on God's goodness. Take time to rest and renew your spirit. Pray that God will show you where he is at work in your life and in our community. Ask where you and our church can join him.

There are a few mission opportunities that the Board has received information about. We want to share this exciting information with you!

InterFaith Works, a part of the Center for New Americans organization, recently met with members of the FM Clergy. Deb Virgo shared with the group a great mission field opening up in the next six months, which involves 190 individuals arriving in our area from the following countries; Burma, Burundi, Cuba, Iraq, Iran and Somalia. Now here's where you come in. **PRAY** for what you could do to help and **pray** for your Mission Board as we look into how we can help and as the Lord directs this great mission outreach. There are a number of different ways either our congregation can help, a group of people could help, or an individual can help either with one refugee family, many refugee families, or the entire Center.

Here are a few instances:

An individual person could help one family with the gift of friendship and tutoring, or many refugee families by taking a family shopping, provide rides to appointments or be a culture broker, or to help the entire Center you could offer office help, donate, or help with special projects. We will post the handout on the information bulletin board at the church for further ideas. If interested, contact any member of the Mission Board! Keep on praying! The second opportunity is about the World Mission Conference sponsored by International Ministries. Normally, this event is held at Green Lakes, WI. This year it will be held in three separate locations at three different times. What's exciting about this year? There is a conference being held at Canandaigua, New York on October 12-14. This is your opportunity to experience a World Mission conference close to home. For more information about the conference, you can visit:

The third opportunity is your chance to share with the Shephard family their experience in Chile. This family night supper will be held on September 21 at 6:30 p.m. in the Chapel and hosted by ABW and the Mission Board. Mark your calendar.
